ADMISSION CRITERIA

In the first instance, priority will be given to children residing within the Wigan borough.

- A. The child has been identified by the LEA as having learning difficulties, or a disability greater than most other children, and will benefit from early integrations: the referral for such children will be via the Education Department Special Needs Section.
- B. The child has a particular social, medical or language needs.

NB Appropriate objective evidence will need to be supplied of the above and referral would normally be via other professional agencies, such as Social Services.

It is also envisaged that the total number of places allocated according to these criteria would form only a relatively small proportion of the total number of children attending the nursery.

- C. Priority should be given to the 'Rising 4' cohort, in order to maximise the opportunities for children to receive at least one year of nursery education before starting school. The majority of places will be allocated to this cohort of children.
- D. Distance from school: this is to be measures in a straight-line distance between front door of the family home and central point in the nursery.

This criterion would be applied to the entire 'Rising 4' cohort after application categories A and B.

This criterion will automatically apply in all community / voluntary controlled Nursery Schools / Units. Criteria for Admissions at voluntary Aided Schools are the responsibility of the Governors. You will need to check with the Headteacher whether the criteria are different from those stated above.

30 HOUR ENTITLEMENT CRITERIA

30 free hours will be available to families where both parents are working (or the sole parent is working in a lone parent family), and each parent earns, on average, a weekly minimum equivalent to 16 hours at national minimum wage (NMW) or national living wage (NLW), and less than £100,000 per year. Working will include employed and self-employed persons. Parents do not necessarily need to actually work 16 hours a week, but rather their earnings must reflect at least 16 hours of work at NMW or NLW, which is £107 a week at the current NMW rate. This includes those parents on zero contract hours who meet the criteria.

POINTS TO REMEMBER WHEN COMPLETING THIS FORM:

- 1. Give the correct home address, i.e. where the child normally lives – not a childminders or grandparents address.
- 2. It is assumed that parents will always give the Authority correct factual information. Parents should be advised that the submission of false information in respect of an application might result in any offer being withdrawn.
- 3. Parents / Guardians should note that there is no guarantee that a child who has a place in nursery will automatically secure a place at the primary / infant school to which the nursery is attached. Equally there is no obligation for a child to attend the school to which the nursery is attached.

NB: The acceptance by the Headteacher for this form duly completed, does not constitute a promise of admission but your application will be carefully considered and the claims of your child weighed against the claims of other children. If any of the above information changes please notify the nursery immediately.
